Science Feature Y6 - Fantastic Forces

This half term, Y6 are learning about forces and simple machines. We have started our topic by revising our knowledge on friction and gravity. We did this by investigating to see whose shoes have the best grip. We used a force meter to see how many Newtons it took to drag each shoe along a surface. The pattern we spotted was that the greater the number of Newtons, the better the grip on the shoe. We are looking forward to investigating air –resistance and up-thrust in the next few weeks.

Well done to Y4/5 class for winning the Golden Broom this week for the tidiest cloakroom area. Who will it be next week?




Parking Issues
