

Desert to garden		Understand	 <p>By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognise what Jesus said on the cross about forgiveness and make simple connections with the belief that God always forgives us. Recognise that Lent is a time for reconciliation and forgiveness. Correctly use religious words and phrases when describing in an age-appropriate way the Sacrament of Reconciliation, making simple connections between the sacrament and a belief in God's forgiveness. Correctly use religious words and phrases to talk about the symbols of light and water in the Easter Vigil Mass.
<p>Hear: By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Jesus enters Jerusalem (Lk 19:28-38) The last supper (Lk 22:7-23, 28-34) The crucifixion and death of Jesus (Lk 23:33-46) The angel's message (Lk 24:9-12) Peter at the tomb (Lk 24:9-12) 			
<p>Believe: By the end of this unit of study pupils will know that the Church teaches:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> That Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to heal and restore our friendship with God and through this ourselves. That Lent is a time of preparing our heart and minds for Easter through reconciliation and forgiveness. The Easter Vigil Mass is the high point of the year and is rich in symbols of light and darkness. 		 <p>By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Looking at works of art to recall the story of Holy week studied in the previous year. Considering some examples of reconciliation and peacebuilding in art, e.g. reconciliation outside Coventry Cathedral. Listening to different sung versions of the Kyrie Eleison and talking about what the words mean. Talking about links between the symbols of light and water at the Easter Vigil and what the symbols remind them of, for example, the story of Creation, the Sacrament of Baptism or Advent. 	
<p>Celebrate: By the end of this unit of study pupils will know</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some prayers and actions are ways in which Catholics turn back to God, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for example, a simple Examen or an act of sorrow and in the Penitential rite, for example, the Kyrie Eleison (Lord have mercy) Some simple words, actions and symbols of the Easter Vigil, focusing on light and water. 	Discern	 <p>By the end of this unit of study, pupils will be invited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Thinking about what forgiveness means to them (RVE). Thinking about how making bad choices can harm themselves and others and why saying sorry matters (RVE). Reflection on how Jesus teaches people to forgive. 	
<p>Live: By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The importance of saying sorry to God and others. That prayer can help people say sorry for their sins. That making bad choices damages relationships and damages them. 		Respond
